A Lasting Power of Attorney is a legal document that you (the Donor) make, using a special form and it has replaced the Enduring Power of Attorney. It allows you to choose someone now (the Attorney) that you trust to make decisions on your behalf at a time in the future when you no longer wish to make those decisions or you may lack the mental capacity to make those decisions yourself. ³
